Hello,

Starting July 1, 2023, the secure infectious disease reporting fax line ending in '0545' will no longer be in service. Please see important information below on infectious disease reporting and faxing to NH Bureau of Infectious Disease Control.

- The Infectious Disease Reporting Forms are available on the NH DHHS website link below.
 - <https://www.dhhs.nh.gov/report-concern/infectious-disease-reporting-and-forms>
- Please use the disease specific forms (if one is available online) and complete it in its entirety.
 - Name of the disease;
 - Name of the person reporting the disease;
 - Patient information: name, date of birth, age, sex, race, ethnicity, address, telephone number, occupation, place of employment, date of illness onset;
 - Diagnostic test information: date, type of test performed, specimen type(s);
 - Treatment Information: date, medication, dosage; and
 - Send a copy of test results - **not** a transcription.
- Fax COVID-19 reports (specifically hospitalizations, deaths, or suspect cases of multisystem inflammatory syndrome in children [MIS-C]), to 1-603-696-3154.
- Fax other infectious disease reports, including HIV, to 1-603-696-3017.

We also ask to you consider updating the bookmarks on your internet browsers to the current location of the reportable disease forms, and review your pre-programmed fax lines to ensure they are up-to-date with the new fax lines noted above.

In addition, we have attached the current NH Reportable Disease List. Please discard any copies with a 'blue box' on the right side of the page, as those are older versions with the discontinued fax information.
